DELHI 2020, the movie "inspired" by events during riots in Northeast Delhi in 2020, will not Northeast Delhiin 2020, will not be screened in theatres or any other platform without a CBFC (Central Board of Film Certification) certification, and a disclaimer will be used for the trailer, the producers told the Delhi High Court on Friday. The assurance came as Additional Solicitor General Chetan Sharma, appearing for the Union government's Ministry of Information and Broadcasting as well as the CBFC, informed Justice Sachin

and Broadcasting as well as the CBPC, informed Justice Sachin Datta that no CBPC certification is required for the release of the trailer of the film on social media. This comes aday after riots ac-cused activist Sharjee Ilmam and is others moved three petitions before the High Court, seeking a stay on the release of the movie stay on the release of the movie slated for release on the other. One of the petitions has been moved by five persons —riot vic-tims Sahil Parvez who lost his fa-ther and Mohd Saeed Salman whose mother was burnt alive; and three accused Akil Ahmed, Sonu and Tasleem Ahmed (who is still in jail. Birds Studio, the production houses for the film represented by senior advocate Jayant Mehta, emphasised before the court that the film is inspired by the true events of the Delhi riots of 2020, events of the Defin 1005 of 2020, as the trailer claims, and that it is only "inspired by and is not a true depiction." Meht a went on to add that they had applied for certification before the CBFC but had not yet received the same.

Both Mehta, as well as ASG Sharma, contested the maintain-

ability of the petitions, adding that it is premature in the absence of CBFC certification and that such a challenge cannot be made without taking recourse under the IT (Intermediary Guidelines and Digital Media Ethics Code).
Pressing for taking down of the trailer, Imam's counsel

the trailer, Imam's counsel Warisha Farasat pointed out, "He (Imam) is the main person who is being shown in the trailer, and why the trailer should go is, the very beginning of the trailer t starts with him... this will be greatly prejudiced against me. Visual medium can have a huge impact and all of these things be-come furndamental. (I have). right to fair trial... (I nave a) right to fair trial... please look at the trailer... they've not tried to hide my identity, they've not tried hidemy identity, they've not tried to show that it's not me., every-thing in the movie (trailer), points to the fact that it is me, right from the comments duplicated from chargesheet attributed to me., there's no way to camouflage the identity, there may be more prejudical things in the movie."

Gangster Neeraj Bawana's uncle injured after car crashes into his Mundka office

AN INDEPENDENT candidate and uncle of jailed gangster Neeraj Bawana was injured after a car crashed into his office in Outer

Delhi's Mundka, police said. Rambir Shokeen, who is con-testing the Delhi polls from Mundka, suffered a leg injury. Police, however, have ruled out any malice. According to police, the inci-dent took place at 11.23 am, prompting a PCR call to the local police station. CCTV footage from the area

showed the car veering off-road and crashing into the office space,

and crashing into the office space, flinging people in the way. According to the investigation, a Class XII student from Kamruddin Nagar was on his way to a farewell party with his uncle in a borrowed car when the accident occurred. "He mistakenly pressed the accelerator of the car and, in panic, turned the steering wheel and the car entered the house of Rambir Shokeen. The boy and his uncle did not run boy and his uncle did not run boy and his uncle did not run away and were at the spot. The call was also made a couple of hoursaferthe incident," said DCP (Outer) Sachin Sharma. Authorities confirmed that he incident was purely acciden-tal and not an act of assault, Police said they have registered a case under relevant sections of the law. Shyken contested the Pall.

under relevant sections of the law. Shokeen contested the Delhi elections in 2013 as an independent candidate and won from Mundka. He was booked under the MCOCA in 2015. According to police, he allegedly provided Bawana financial and logistic support and used the gangster's clout while contesting elections. He was subsequently arrested in 2016, after a year of being on the run from the police. Following his arrest, Shokeen

run from the police rent, Shokeen escaped from the custody of Utar Pradesh Police from Safdarjung Hospital in 2018 and was arrested again in 2020. He was acquitted of MCOCA charges in 2023 but was jailed for four months for repeatedly ignoring court summons.
